

The problems of Internet society.

We discussed about the internet problems in Russia and Japan. We have created internet society, but at the same time, it is true that we have a lot of problems. During the session, we talked about the differences and similarities about the internet problems and we have some ideas and recommendations to solve the problems. First we will explain about the different view points between Japan and Russia. Then we will move to the similarities. At the end, we will talk about the recommendations to solve the problems.

First, we will explain about the differences. In Japan, one of the problems that we have is, murdering (internet users find people on free chat. They keep talking and feel closer even though they are strangers. Then, they meet in person, and sometimes it is used as the tool to pick up victims of murder.) Another problem is slander (People criticize one specific thing about one person on the internet.) Inadequate laws against violation of copyrights are one of biggest problems, too. In Russia, the problems are there are no laws and regulations against internet crimes at all, gambling on the internet, and regional differences, such as cost differences and differences of internet connection areas.

Second, we will talk about the similarities. The five controversial problems are internet dependence, losing traditions, violation of rights of privacy, child pornography, and adult sites, and disinformation. The best solution to the last three problems would be implementation of laws and regulations. As for the internet dependence, it happens to anyone in any religion, culture, or sex. The reason is because we can use the internet anywhere in the world thanks to Wi-Fi. In Russia, many people are addicted to chat. They use chatting even at work in order to communicate in the working place. In Japan, cell phone addiction is one of the biggest causes of the internet dependence. Japanese cell phones are very convenient enough. We can access to the internet, take pictures and videos, listen to music, exchange files by using infrared and blue tooth, and even pay money through cell phones.

To solve this problem, everyone should cooperate, including governments, communities, schools, and other organizations. Parents control and education should be done at home. Commercials and promotion should be done by companies. Public activities, such as doing sports outside and building new parks, should be implemented in communities. Also, alternative opportunities, such as talking with friends at café, reading books in library, going shopping, and going to music concert, should be provided more.

As for losing traditions, in Russia, people use incorrect words, called Albanian language, as if it is actually correct words as a part of Russian language even in public. It is used as kind of slang. In Japan, the big problem is that hand writing is getting bad. We know less Chinese characters because the computers automatically choose the right Chinese characters. In addition, we Japanese use foreign languages like Russians use Albanian. For

example, we use other languages alphabet as symbols to express our feelings, for example, (; ɗ;*), ι (@ɗ@)l √.

To solve these problems, in Russia, the government should prohibit using the “Albanian language” in public places. In both countries, we should improve the education systems. Schools should provide more classes to teach not only how to use the computer, but also how to write by your hand on a piece of paper and ethics and morals when you learn how to use the computer and the internet.

In conclusion, we have found that Japan and Russia have lots of both similarities and differences about the internet problems. We often have different view points and completely different problems. But at the same time, we have more common issues, so let’s keep discussion for our better future.
