2. Cooperation between the OCOG Tokyo-2020 International Russian Olympic University

- 2) Advanced re-training (for degree holders);
- 3) Consultations, trainings, workshops offered by the University's commission of Experts in Japan.

Examples:


- Japan-Korea FIFA World Cup 2002;
